## On Campground Activities



**Trap Shooting** - (minimum of 10 guests) \$10.  
Bring your own shot gun or .22 pistol and ammunition. (Less than 10 minutes from our campground.)

### **Lake Cruise** - \$10

Two hour-long trips are planned.  
(Maximum of 9 guests per trip)  
Leave from campground dock.



**Kayaks & Lake Fun** - A few kayaks are available or bring your own, as well as other equipment for an afternoon of fun on the lake. *Note: The water will still be pretty cold in late April.*


### **Fishing**

## Off Campground Planned Excursions



### Scenic Drive and Shopping in Eureka Springs

Approximate 45 minute drive  
each way. Share gasoline and  
parking expenses per vehicle.



### Scenic Drive and Cave Tour Cosmic Cavern

Approximate 45 minute drive each way.  
Guided walking tour is 1 hour and 15  
minutes, 1/3 mile. Some stairs but  
mostly level.

Cost: \$20 adult ticket and share  
gasoline expenses. Gift shop on site.



### Scenic Drive, Hiking and Sightseeing Dogwood Canyon Nature Park,

Approximate 45 to 50 minute drive each way.  
Ticket cost: \$13.50 to \$15.00 for adults.  
Ticket gives access to working grist mill, Canyon  
Grill Restaurant, artifact display, Nature and  
Conservation Center, Treehouse Masters  
Treehouse and miles of both paved and natural  
hiking and biking trails. Bike rental available.

## Additional Excursion Ideas On Your Own

### Top of the Rock at Big Cedar Lodge



With views that last for miles, Top of the Rock features activities, attractions and shopping to explore and learn about the rich history of the Ozarks.

Attractions include the Lost Canyon Cave and Nature Trail, Ancient Ozarks Natural History Museum, the recently formed Cathedral of Nature, legendary golf courses, and world-class dining.

Approximately 80 minutes from Camp Table Rock, there is a \$10 per car entry fee upon arrival at Top of the Rock.

An adult ticket for an electric cart ride along Lost Canyon Cave & Nature Trail and including admission to the Ancient Ozarks Natural History Museum is \$29.25 to \$37.00 depending on when you visit. Check the website for more options.

### Roaring River State Park



Roaring River State Park features a natural spring that gushes 20 million gallons of water daily, creating a great trout fishing stream which is stocked daily from the on-site trout hatchery.

Fishing licenses and tags are available at the park store. Visitors can feed the fish in the various pools at the fish hatchery. Or, take a short walk to view the mouth of the spring. There are also several popular hiking trails winding through the amazing scenery. Roaring River State Park is about 50 minutes from Camp Table Rock. No entry fees.



## Promised Land Zoo

Home to hundreds of rare and endangered animals from around the world, Promised Land Zoo is the kind of place where you can GET CLOSER and more personal to so many of these dwindling species! The Eureka Springs Safari Park is about 50 minutes from Camp Table Rock. There is also a location in Branson, Missouri. Each zoo is unique.

Basic Admission: \$22.95 adults age 13-54, \$12.95 age 55 and over. This admission is for a self-guided drive through tour.

These are just a sampling of the many fun and interesting things to do in this area of the Ozark Mountains.
