

The Alabaster Offering is a special offering taken in the Church of the Nazarene twice a year, in the months of February and September. It is named after the alabaster container mentioned in Luke 7:37-38, where a woman pours expensive perfume from an alabaster jar onto Jesus' feet.

The Alabaster offering is intended to support missions and ministries around the world by constructing church buildings, schools, medical facilities, and other infrastructure. The funds collected through the Alabaster Offering are used to meet specific needs identified by the church's leadership and are distributed through the denomination's global missions program.

The Alabaster Offering is one way for congregations to contribute to spreading the Gospel and being involved in the ministry in communities beyond their own local congregation.

The most widely used way to collect the Alabaster Offering is the Alabaster Box. Individuals are challenged to regularly contribute the cost of items they desire but do not need and place it in the Alabaster Box. The boxes also serve as reminders to pray for those people who will benefit from Alabaster buildings.

Praying Daily for Missionaries



The following are daily suggestions of ways you can pray for missionaries, as well as all workers around the world who minister for Jesus Christ:

Sunday: Spiritual Life— A closer walk with God. Missionaries need times of refreshing just as much as everyone else. Those in ministry give on a regular basis. Pray that they will take the time to be filled so that they will not be running on empty or on their own strength.

Monday: Mind— The ability to learn what is needed, be it language and culture or a new way of getting things done. Pray that their minds will be open and accepting to the new things that greet them Louise Bustle, director of Nazarene Global Mission, has said missionaries need to "trust the locals." It is easier to think that we have all the answers than to admit we need to learn.

Tuesday: Team—The people the missionaries work with—for good relationships that will build up the work and honor God. Pray the local people whose lives are touched by the missionaries, as well as missionary coworkers and leaders.

Wednesday: Well-being—No one likes being sick. Illness in another cultural context can be scary and even dangerous. Malaria and other diseases for which the missionaries have not built up immunity can be deadly. Health care can be hard to find. Driving over rough roads, air travel, and other modes of transportation can be fraught with ...excitement. Pray for physical safety from illness and for travel safety.

Thursday: Thoughts— Pray that the missionaries will not be discouraged. Pray that they will remain focused on the things of God. There are "get-thee-behind-me" moments in everyone's life. Pray that the missionaries will be able to discern those moments for what they are and be bold in confronting them.

Friday: Family— Spouse, sons and daughters, sisters and brothers, mother and father. Some of these people will be Christian, others not. Some will be going through a crisis—physical, spiritual, or emotional—which drains the missionary. Sometimes the stress comes from being in the situation; at other times the stress comes from being half the world away. Pray for peace, contentment, and open communication between the missionary and family members.

Saturday: Schedule— As the week comes to a close and missionaries are planning the week ahead, pray that their schedules will be filled with divine appointments. Pray that when schedules are disrupted the missionaries will see the hand of God at work and not be angry, but rather expectant.



"...We used to call it General..." excerpt from Howard Culbertson's <u>Our Balanced</u> Attack, How Nazarenes Finance World Evangelism.

"....as in General Budget, but it's very specific.

As I stumbled along, I learned that a good computer will do spectacular things! From the experience I've even picked up a sermon illustration or two. One comes from basic computer technology. You see, without software or programs, a computer is useless. Take away software's complex instructions, and even the most expensive computer is a useless collection of exotic electronic parts.

In some ways Nazarene World Evangelism Fund (WEF) resembles a computer's operating system software. World Evangelism Fund "boots up" or starts our worldwide system and provides an operating environment. It draws together the basic elements of global evangelism and fits them together in an effective manner. Without the structure provided by WEF, Nazarene world outreach would grind to a halt. To be sure, WEF provides only part of Nazarene missionary funding. Offerings like Approved Specials, Work & Witness, Alabaster, Radio, Child Sponsorship, and Hunger and Disaster build on what WEF is doing. Giving in such special, designated offerings easily arouses more interest and emotion than does paying WEF. A whispered temptation comes to let WEF giving slide while concentrating on some favorite special offering. That would be a mistake. Special offerings, no matter how large or emotionally rewarding, do not pay missionaries' salaries, keep hospital doors open, or carry out strategies on a global scale. Without WEF we might revert to spotty, fitful efforts financed on emotional whims.

Where does it go?

Thanksgiving (or Christmas in countries other than the US and Canada) and Easter offerings. Our slogans sometimes lead people to assume that the World Mission office gets every penny of these big offerings. Forgetting that it began as "General" Budget, they express surprise —even dismay—that the Global Mission does not get every WEF dollar.

Actually, each WEF dollar is divided among all the ministry areas of the global church such as Sunday School, Nazarene Youth International, World Mission, and higher education on all six world regions. At the Nazarene Global Ministry Center and in Regional Offices around the world, more than 200 people work in these ministry areas. WEF pays most of their salaries and funds most of those programs.

The simplest way to explain where WEF dollars go was with an 80/20 formula. Of each WEF dollar, about 80 cents goes to world missions outreach. The remaining 20 cent is for other global church ministries and overall administration. In stark contrast to what happens in many nonprofit organizations, very little goes to actual fund-raising. Even costs labeled "administration" are sometimes misleading. Take the general superintendents, for example. They are part of the 20% administration. Still, Dr. William Greathouse preaching to 3,000 people in Port-au-Prince probably was more "evangelism" than I was on the days I spent double-checking Haitian district statistical reports before mailing them to Kansas City. Yet, for reporting purpose, I was considered "evangelism" and Dr. Greathouse's support was labeled "administration".

A few years ago, a general superintendent was in Haiti holding district assemblies. He heard about a young pastor's wife who was seriously ill. Three hundred dollars of medical bills had far outstripped that struggling family's resources. Unless past due bills were paid, she would get no more medical help. When that general superintendent departed Haiti, he left behind, \$300 to wipe out those bills. The fund he used that day was a part of the WEF labeled "general administration". So even some of those expenses labeled "general administration" could well be called "world evangelism".

Not everyone is happy with the 80/20 disbursement plan. Some complain that too much money goes overseas. There is much yet to be done at home, they argue. We're top-heavy in foreign missions spending, they say..........It isn't "us" here and "them" over there anymore. It's not just one or two countries giving all the money, sending all the missionaries, and making all the decisions. We Nazarenes all around the world are now all in it together. The only "them" are peoples outside the gospel message, in whatever country they may be... (to read more go to

"LINKS" HAS BECOME "CARE AND CONNECTION" GLOBAL LINKS POLICY

ADOPTED GLOBAL NMI EXECUTIVE COUNCIL - 28 JANUARY, 2022

Links is a Nazarene Missions International (NMI) system to assist districts in providing care and connection to Nazarene missionaries.

Global Scope

Each region, through the sending district, provides care and connection to Nazarene missionaries sent from their region. Links provides additional care and connection to globally deployed missionaries who are deployed from your region and other regions. Only missionaries assigned through the Links system, should be referred to as Links missionaries. Links assignments are made by global NMI in consultation with the regional NMI coordinator.

Global, Sponsored, and Retiree Missionary Involvement

Care and connection is provided to every global and sponsored Nazarene missionary who is on contract with Global Missions, by their home district.

Retired missionaries, who meet Global Missions requirements as a retiree, are provided care and connection by their home district.

Globally deployed missionaries are eligible to be assigned to any district in the Church of the Nazarene for additional care and connection through Links.

Global Process & Procedures

<u>Assignment:</u> The Links connection is between a district/country/field and the missionary. Local churches should work with the district to care for their missionaries including those assigned through Links. Globally assigned missionaries must respond to the global NMI office by the deadline given to participate in Links. It is possible that not every globally deployed missionary will receive a Links assignment each year.

<u>Assignment Length</u>: All assignments are one year in length and will be from January 1 – December 31 each year regardless of the fiscal/church year. Districts, whose Links assigned missionary end their Global Missions contract by September 1, will receive another Links assignment for the remainder of that Links year.

Monetary Gifts: Any monetary gifts for missionaries through Links, will be processed through the missionary's deputation account. Gifts to retired missionaries must be given directly to them.

<u>Participation:</u> It is anticipated that each Links participant (district/country/field and missionary) will: Pray for each other., Communicate with each other at least three times a year, The district/country/field will invite the Links missionary to speak at events in person or online.

Instructions for packing

- Gather NEW items in quantities listed below. Assemble Crisis Care Kits (CCKs) and seal the Ziploc bags. Include only those items listed below. Deviating from this list can cause an entire shipment to be rejected in customs. Set the CCKs in groups of six (6) to determine the number of banana boxes needed.
- 2. Pack new items into a clear 2-gallon OR 2.5-gallon plastic Ziploc bag and seal. 3. Obtain the banana boxes from your local grocery store. Please pack CCKs solely in banana boxes, as they provide uniformity, eliminating wasted space in shipping. 4. Cut the heavy brown paper (usually found in the banana box) in half and place inside the bottom of the box. Tape the other half over the hole in the lid. (Plain cardboard may be used in the same way if your banana boxes are missing the paper.)
- 5. Fill each box with six (6) CCKs—no more, no less. Do not insert money or literature (including anything with the church's name on it, notes, etc.) in the CCKs or banana boxes.
- 6. Using strong packing tape, cover all holes in the top and the bottom of the box. Then tape the box securely shut. Please leave box handles open; this makes it easier to load and unload.
- DO NOT wrap banana boxes in brown paper or contact paper or put filled banana boxes inside another box.



Deputation funds are used to finance ministry expenses not covered by other funding sources.

These funds can be used for a wide variety of things. Uses range from support for salary and benefits to things like setting up a house. Note: All non-consumable items purchased with deputation funds are the property of Global Missions.

A wide variety of expenses are eligible for reimbursement from deputation funds. Some examples are:

- Freight and Duty Expenses
- Conference Expenses
- Appliances
- Furnishings
- Office Supplies
- · Prayer Cards
- E-newsletter Fees
- · Equipment Purchases
- Vehicle Purchase
- Vehicle Maintenance
- Continuing Education
- · Language study
- · Field Projects
- Passport and Visa
- · Small home appliances
- Living Allowance (while on home assignment; established limits)
- Deputation tour expenses (air travel, meals, tolls, fuel, car rental, lodging, etc.)
- Undergraduate tuition (established limits)
- Retirement fund (based on years of service)
- Medical Reimbursement for out of pocket expenses (i.e. HSA)
- Retirement resettlement allowance (established limits)

Deputation funds are not for personal items. Such items include, but are not limited to:

- Household supplies
- Food not related to deputation travel
- Clothing
- Personal entertainment
- Cosmetics

NMI Mission Committee Report

2024

We, your Committee on World Mission, refer our people to the NMI Convention section of the *Joplin District Annual Assembly Journal*.

We recommend that every local NMI council review the goals for Mission Priority One as soon as possible in the assembly year and make definite plans to attain Mission Priority One status. The goals are:

- 1. Prayer—The church will pray for missions and missionaries.
- 2. Discipling—The church will provide opportunity for its children and youth to experience missions and to respond to God's call.
- 3. Giving The church will pay its World Evangelism Fund in full.
- 4. Educating—The church will use missions resources and participate in activities to gain better understanding of global mission efforts. The church must participate in one or more activities in each of the following four areas:
- ⇒ Use missions resources (such as NMI Central, World Mission videos, mission websites, Nazarene Communications News, etc.), and/or utilize missions publications and communications (NMI Central, Nazarene Compassionate Ministries magazine, Holiness Today, missionaries' newsletters, regional newsletters, etc.).
- ⇒ Use the NMI Central Children's Information, called, "Kids Kaleidoscope".
- ⇒ Participate in missions service projects (such as Work and Witness, Compassionate Ministries centers, Good Samaritan churches, community projects, etc.) and/or hands-on missions activities (Crisis Care Kits, School Pal-Paks, Relief shipments, Care and Connection support, etc.).
- ⇒ Attend one or more services with a mission speaker (local, mission area, district, and/or regional events; Faith Promise) and/or provide interaction with a mission's speaker (district teen/children's camps, missions events, district missions convention, missions workshops, etc.).

We encourage each church to complete the following:

That each NMI Mission Priority One church strive also to do the following:

- ⇒ Receive the Award of Excellence by paying 5.7% over their World Evangelism Fund goal.
- ⇒ Pay in full its Children's/Teen Project, Work and Witness Project.
- ⇒ Participate in the Missionary Health Care, World Mission Broadcast, Nazarene Compassionate

Ministries Fund, and Alabaster offerings.

- ⇒ Support one or more missionaries with a deputation offering.
- ⇒ That each church supports the Nazarene Compassionate Ministries Fund, be a child sponsor, and strive to be a Good Samaritan church.
- ⇒ That each new church member receives a new member packet, which explains our mission program.
- ⇒ That each church especially remembers our own retired district missionaries Elizabeth Glasgow, Lois Rosbrugh, Barbara Simmons, Merrill and Jan Williams in prayer, with a specific time designated to pray and fast on their behalf.
- ⇒ That each church supports our Care and Connection missionaries through prayer, gifts, money, and cards, as we are the only district responsible for them. New LINKS missionaries will be assigned each January. In addition, our Joplin District Local LINKS are Hal and Moon Brower and Berna Proffitt.
- 5. That each church be aware of all NMI projects:
- ⇒ Teen and Children's Project Send the money for this project to the district NMI treasurer as the offering is received, but no later than March 1, 2025.
- ⇒ Work and Witness Project Send money for this project to the district NMI treasurer as soon as possible. Money should be in before March 1, 2025.

Note: The local allocations of all the projects are in the President's Planner and the Convention packet.

That we embrace our quadrennial theme Advance: The Call.

NMI Finance Committee 2024

The following is recommended by your Committee on Finance:

- That we promote 100 percent payment of the World Evangelism Fund which supports the missionary work of the Church of the Nazarene worldwide.
- That the district NMI apportionment for the coming year be set at 5.6 percent of the District Unified Budget (which includes General Convention Fund and District Expense) as recommended by the District Finance Committee.
- That the Missionary Care and Connection Fund assigned to each local church be taken and sent to the Global Treasury by September 15, 2025.
- All churches are urged to send in 5.5 percent of total monies raised for our District Budget, less adjustments. This budget supports all entities of the district as well as New Starts/district mission work.
- That the district NMI set aside \$6,250 a year for general convention expenses.
- That, as a district, we send a love gift of \$50 per adult and \$25 per child living in the home to missionaries who are members of our district: Elizabeth Glasgow, Lolis Rosbrugh, Barbara Simmons, Merrill and Jan Williams, and the Executive Directors of the Potter's House.
- That we budget \$1,000 for Children's Missionary Fun Day.
- That we budget \$100 for each Joplin District college student who participates in a college
 or general church sponsored Nazarene Work and Witness trip, when a request is received
 from that student
- That we budget \$300 for a missionary-in-residence at each week of Teen Camp and \$250 for Children's Camp.
- That we budget \$5,000.00 for Work and Witness projects in our district.
- That we budget \$2,500 for the Joplin District Hispanic Ministry.
- 12. That we continue to take care of the expenses of the various district officers in connection with their duties as follows: district president honorarium, \$400; district superintendent honorarium, \$200; treasurer honorarium, \$300; secretary honorarium, \$300; recording secretary honorarium, \$50; office manager honorarium, \$50; council travel reimbursement at the same rate as set by the Joplin District Finance Committee, plus meals; also any other incidental expense related to duties; expense stipend of \$15 per council member


